
Diena Georgetti seeks the formulation of her art and her own creativity through both the things of the spirit (the impetus of ideas and emotions) and through the materiality of life. Art, life, the earth, spirit, matter (geology, ecology and other forms of knowledge) interweave as open systems within which the artist stakes her own claim and asserts identity.

As if by instinct, this young artist is heir to the forms and anti-forms of arte povera. Her materials are elemental; chalk, glass, board, wood, light, pencil markings, and the objects in her work are often found and assimilated from the world. The poetic effect of her installations lies in their reductive qualities, a deliberate roughness, and a sense of their being ephemeral – an amalgam of materials and experiences which takes a special place within the flux and changeability of the everyday. Georgetti has a strong feeling for the symbolic and cultural resonances of materials, objects and shapes, and many of her works have involved strategic if subtle interventions into architectural and photographic sites.

The darkened room of this current installation is not unlike a reading room in a library, or a science room in a museum – sites for learning, growth, the production and communication of ideas. A living creature, of pre-historic origin, swims in a glass tank – a metaphor for evolution, for creation, a living art? Blackboards, often used by Georgetti (after Beuys) as means of tracing information and recording ideas, are here lit by tubes of light, and marked by the rudimentary tracings of the artist's hand. The words, in German, which she has inscribed on the boards point to a reading of creativity, aesthetics and the imagination that involves a change in perception, a rethinking of ideas, a shift in musical key.

Art, Georgetti proposes, is a parallel consciousness which connects and creatively converges with what is already present in life, and goes some way towards unravelling life's mysteries and its pattern. The process of art making itself becomes a metaphor for the accumulation of knowledge and its functioning within the world. The work further suggests a relationship between art, ethics and aesthetics. Central to Georgetti's concerns as an artist is a sense of the interconnectedness of all things.
